On July 19, the USGA announced that the World Golf Hall of Fame is coming back to its original home and will open as we approach the 2024 U.S. Open in Pinehurst. Last week, the USGA also wrapped up a successful inaugural staging of the U.S. Adaptive Open. If you did not attend, it was truly an amazing championship and so inspirational to see all of the competitors in person. Make plans to attend next July as the event returns to Pinehurst No. 6.

If you swing by Pinehurst Country Club, you will see that work has commenced on Golf House Pinehurst, which should be completed near the end of 2023. The U.S. Kids World Championships are back in town as 2,200 competitors and their families descend upon our area and we welcome them as always. Be sure to attend the Parade of Nations on the evening of Tuesday, Aug. 2nd in the Village of Pinehurst.

We recently wrapped up our 2021-22 fiscal year that ended on June 30th. When the official numbers are released on Aug. 1, the CVB will record its first-ever \$3 million year in hotel occupancy tax collections – the life-blood of our business that allows us to effectively promote tourism to the 1.5 million

people that visit Moore County each year. This milestone is reached just one year after we recorded our first-ever \$2 million year. Clearly, the growth of tourism here is record-breaking and historic and I can assure you we are the envy of dozens of other CVBs across North Carolina. 
