
FROM THE DESK OF THE PRESIDENT

World-renowned artist with Sandhills roots, Patrick Dougherty has come home. His sculptures have been produced worldwide and as this 75-year-old artist closes his career, he has produced perhaps his final creation at Sandhills Community College. The Sandhills Horticultural Society is hosting Dougherty as he installs one of his unique sapling sculptures on the lawn behind the Ball Garden Visitors' Center on campus. Dougherty was born in Oklahoma but grew up in Southern Pines, where he roamed the woods as a child. Specifically, he loved exploring a dogwood grove near St. Joseph of the Pines with his sister. The 2022 U.S. Women's Open will be the seventh USGA championship hosted by Pine Needles and record fourth U.S. Women's Open. The last U.S. Women's Open conducted at Pine Needles was the 2007 championship when Cristie Kerr won the first of her two majors with a two-stroke victory over Lorena Ochoa and Angela Park. Pine Needles has an incredible legacy of USGA championships, producing life-changing moments for the game's greatest athletes," said Reg Jones, USGA managing director, Open championships. 
